## 1. Disability Allowance [NOT Illness Benefit]

Disability Allowance, which is means tested, is a weekly payment that an individual may receive if:

- the individual has a disability that is expected to last for at least one year, and
- the individual is aged between 16 and under 66.

Disability Allowance is not to be regarded as income for any purposes of the Income Tax Acts.

## 2. Disabled Persons Rehabilitation Allowance

This is an additional allowance payable by the HSE to persons who are in receipt of a Disability Allowance or other similar payment from the Department of Social Protection and who are living away from home while undertaking rehabilitation training.

The Disabled Person's Rehabilitation Allowance is not to be regarded as income for any purposes of the Income Tax Acts.
