Explanatory Notes

1. You can claim a refund of Deposit Interest Retention Tax (DIRT) if you and/or your spouse were either:

- aged 65 years or over before 6 April 1999 or
- if under 65, permanently incapacitated by mental or physical infirmity from maintaining yourself

and you were exempt from tax or your allowances/reliefs exceeded your income in the year ended 5 April 1999.

Exemption Limits: You are exempt from tax for 1998/99 if your total income (i.e. gross income less certain deductions) is below the following amounts:

	Under 65	65-74	75 or over
Single or Widowed	€ 5,206	€ 6,350	€ 6,984
Married Couple (Combined Income)	€ 10,412	€ 12,700	€ 13,968

These limits are increased by € 572 each for the first and second dependent child and € 826 for each subsequent dependent child. Where income is not greatly above the exemption limit marginal relief may apply.

If you need more information on exemption from tax, please ask for **leaflet IT 8** "Tax Exemption & Marginal Relief" from any tax office.

2. If you already made a claim for a refund of DIRT for 1998/99 you may ignore this form.

If you are self-employed, including farming, or otherwise taxable do not use this form. Contact your tax office for the correct form.

3. Attach certificates from the relevant financial institutions (An Post, banks, building societies etc.) These certificates should show:

- amount of gross interest paid or credited
- tax deducted
- net amount paid
- date of payment during the year ended 5 April 1999.
