You should complete this form if you are in receipt of a CervicalCheck Payment and wish to apply to have your deposit interest earned on the monies deposited paid to you without deduction of DIRT.

CervicalCheck Payment means any of the following:

- a payment made under the CervicalCheck non-disclosure ex-gratia Scheme.
- a payment made under the CervicalCheck Tribunal Act 2019.
- a payment in respect of compensation awarded by the courts or made under an out-of-court settlement but excluding any compensation to a dependent for mental distress resulting from the impacted woman's death.

The exemption from DIRT applies to deposit interest earned on the deposit of CervicalCheck Payment monies only. Accordingly, a separate account will be required to be opened to hold the CervicalCheck Payment monies. The exemption from DIRT will not apply if the CervicalCheck Payment monies were deposited with other monies.

If a third party (such as a relative) has authority to operate your bank account on your behalf you will still be entitled to the DIRT exemption, provided the beneficial ownership of your account is not affected.

To apply for the DIRT exemption complete the form overleaf and return it to:

A separate form is required for each account you (and your spouse or civil partner if applicable) opened with CervicalCheck Payment monies.

Joint accounts qualify for the exemption only where the two account holders are a married couple or civil partners.

If your account ceases to qualify for the DIRT exemption in respect of the deposit interest earned on the CervicalCheck Payment monies you are obliged to notify Revenue immediately.

It is an offence to make a false declaration.

This is a form authorised by the Revenue Commissioners.

Single Euro Payments Area (SEPA)
