How to apply for a new Gaming Licence and Gaming Machine Licence(s)

Gaming Licence

Requirements:

A valid **Tax Clearance Certificate** is required where the applicant is an individual. Corporate applications will require a valid Tax Clearance Certificate for the company. Certificates do not need to be submitted. Revenue automated systems will verify that current Tax Clearance Certificates are in place.

Required Documents to accompany this Form:

Valid, original Gaming and Lotteries Act 1956, Section 15 Gaming Court Certificate available from the District Court Office.

How to apply for a Gaming Licence:

1. Complete the Application Form and submit with a valid, original Gaming Court Certificate to the National Excise Licence Office, Government Offices, The Glen, Waterford.
2. The completed Application Form is processed and if approved an Application Notice will issue.
3. On receipt of your Application Notice, you can apply for your Gaming Licence using the **Payment Options** below.

Gaming Machine Licence(s)

Requirements:

You must hold a valid Tax Clearance Certificate. However, **do not** submit the Certificate with your Application.

Required Documents:

A current, valid Gaming Licence (see above).

How to apply for a Gaming Machine Licence(s):

1. Complete the Application Form overleaf and submit to the National Excise Licence Office, Government Offices, The Glen, Waterford.
2. The completed Application Form is processed and if approved an Application Notice will issue.
3. On receipt of your Application Notice, you can apply for your Gaming Machine Licence(s) using the **Payment Options** below.

- **By completion of the Payslip located at the bottom of the Application Notice:** Payment should be made by cheque/bank draft and made payable to the Collector-General using the prepaid envelope provided. **Do not enclose Cash**
