In August, the [Cost of Tax Expenditures publication](#) was updated and reconfigured in accordance with Recommendation 16.6 of the recent *Commission on Taxation and Welfare*. A note is available on our website outlining the changes.

We also published the [Pre Budget 2024 Ready Reckoner](#). The Ready Reckoner is updated pre and post Budget, based on the most recently available data on tax returns and receipts, and, as such, presents a best assessment of the Exchequer impact of potential or actual tax policy changes.
