# Method Statement for **Help to Buy**Dataset

### 1. Introduction

The purpose of this document is to provide information on the commitment to quality activities and procedures Revenue has put in place in respect of the production of Revenue Statistics to comply with the Irish Statistical System Code of Practice (ISSCOP).<sup>1</sup>

This in this release are based on analysis of applications and dataset provides statistics claims filed in respect of the HTB incentive.

The Help To Buy (HTB) incentive, announced in Budget 2017 (October 2016), is designed to assist first-time buyers with the deposit required to purchase or self-build a new house or apartment to live in as their home. The incentive provides for a refund of Income Tax and DIRT paid over the previous four tax years, limited to a maximum of 5% of the purchase value up to a value of €400,000. The HTB refund is capped at €20,000. This incentive is available for the period from 19 July 2016 to 31 December 2019.

For a property to be eligible for HTB it cannot exceed a value of €600,000 in the period from 19 July to 31 December 2016 or €500,000 in the period from 1 January 2017 to 31 December 2019.

### **Purchase Value/Amount of Relief**

- Up to €400,000 Up to 5% of purchase price
- Between €400,000 and €500,000, from 1 Jan 2017 Max relief will be €20,000
- Over €500,000, from 1 Jan 2017 No relief
- Between €400,000 & €600,000, between 19 Jul 2016 & 31 Dec 2016 Max relief will be €20,000
- Over €600,000, between 19 Jul 2016 & 31 Dec 2016 No relief

The property must be occupied by the first-time buyer, or at least one of the first-time buyers in the case of multiple first-time buyers, within 2 years and for a minimum period of five years.
