Revenue would like to remind traders that, as advised in [eCustoms Helpdesk Notification Ref 004/2019](#), enhancements were made to the Customs IT systems including NCTS to allow traders to lodge a combined outbound transit/safety and security declaration for goods that only transit to or through GB. Detailed information on the transit procedure is available in the [NCTS Trader Guide](#).

When transiting goods to or through GB, traders must submit:

- a Transit Declaration which includes S&S data
- OR**
- an Exit Summary Declaration (EXS) and a Transit Declaration.

These declarations will be risk assessed and goods in transit may be subject to a documentary check or a physical control.

For transit, a control decision notification message (IE060) will issue, if a Customs control is required. Supporting documents (e.g. full groupage manifest) must then be uploaded via MyEnquiries as advised in [eCustoms Helpdesk Notification No 006/2017](#) Annex 1 with 'Transit Declaration' selected. If a physical examination is necessary, Customs will provide further instructions.

Authorised traders initiating transits under simplified procedure must wait for any necessary controls, including Safety & Security controls, to be carried out by the office of departure before goods can leave their premises.
