# CERTEX Single Window - Critical Elements

1. CHED/COI Certificate Number
2. Net Mass
3. CN Code
4. Supplementary Units





# CERTEX Single Window - Validation

## Stage 1 – Declaration Submission

- CHED/COI Certificate Number
- Status of Certificate

## Stage 2 – Presentation of the Goods

- Net Mass
- CN Code
- Supplementary Units



# CERTEX Single Window – Declaration Changes



CHED/COI certificate number must be declared at goods shipment **item level** on the customs declaration.

CHED/COI certificate number must be declared for each and every **line item** on the customs declaration where the CN code requires a CHED/COI
