## Stage 1 – Declaration Submission - CHED/COI Certificate Number

Status of Certificate

Stage 2 – Presentation of the Goods

- Net Mass
- CN Code
- Supplementary Units





CHED/COI certificate number must be declared at goods shipment **item level** on the customs declaration.

CHED/COI certificate number must be declared for each and every **line item** on the customs declaration where the CN code requires a CHED/COI
