Proof of Union Status



- The Customs Status of goods refers to their status as Union or non-Union goods.
- In general, all goods within the customs territory of the Union are presumed to have the customs status of Union goods unless it is established that they are not Union goods.
- However, there are circumstances where the presumption of having the customs status of Union goods does not apply and the status of the goods must be proven, such as when goods:
 - are taken out of the Customs Territory of the Union
 - are placed under the external transit procedure



Proof of Union Status



- The economic operator should be able to prove the customs status of the goods:
 - Where the presumption of the customs status of the goods does not apply
 - Where Union goods have been taken out of the Customs Territory of the Union.
- Union goods may move from one point to another within the customs territory of the Union and temporarily out of that territory without being subject to a customs procedure and without their status being altered if their customs status of Union goods is proven.
- An example of a scenario where the Customs Status of goods as Union goods must be proven is when Union goods are transported on a non-Regular Shipping Service, i.e.
IE – UK – FR.



Proof of Union Status



- While there are a number of ways to prove the Customs Status of goods, the primary method is the use of the T2L and T2LF.
- The T2L is utilised for goods which are in free circulation within the Customs Territory of the Union.
- The T2LF is utilised for goods transported to, from or between the non-fiscal territories of the Union, such as:
 - The Canary Islands;
 - The following French Overseas Departments: Guadeloupe, Martinique, Mayotte, French Guiana and Réunion;
 - Mount Athos;
 - The Åland Islands



PoUS electronic system



- The European Commission is launching an electronic PoUS system.
- This is part of the Union Customs Code (UCC) Work Programme and is in line with the requirement that all exchanges of information should be made electronically.
- The new electronic PoUS system will be delivered in two phases:
 - Phase 1 will become operational on the 1 March 2024 and will cover T2L/T2LF documents.
 - Phase 2 will cover PoUS in the form of the Customs Goods Manifest (CGM) and will only apply to maritime transport. The current deployment date for phase 2 is August 2025.



PoUS electronic system



- From 1 March 2024, you will be required to apply for a T2L/T2LF in the new EU PoUS system. Paper documents of T2L/T2LF will no longer be accepted in any Member State.
- There will be two elements to the PoUS system:
 - the **Back Office portal** (Customs officers will have access)
 - &
 - the **Specific Trader Portal (STP)** – this is an EU Portal and will be accessible through a trader's ROS account and will require manual input of the required data. There will be a direct link to the portal on the Revenue website for convenience.



How to gain access to the PoUS Trader Portal.

- You must have a Revenue Online Service (ROS) digital certificate. You will find information about obtaining a ROS certificate in [Guide to ROS](#) on the Revenue website.
- You must have an [Economic Operator Registration and Identification \(EORI\)](#) number and be registered for Customs and Excise (C&E) on ROS.
- You must be authenticated in the trader portal. This is handled by the Uniform User Management & Digital Signature (UUM&DS) system together with ROS. You can use the UUM&DS to assign responsibility for customs applications and authorisations (delegation) to your customs representative. You will find further information about how to create and manage these roles in [Access Management through UUM&DS](#).



Functions of the PoUS Trader Portal

- Submit a T2L/T2LF request
- Submit supplementary documents for an Endorsement Request
- Create a Presentation Notification
- Submit supplementary documents for a Proof
- Receive notifications related to your request or proof
- Respond to requests from Customs for further information
- Check the status of the request or proof

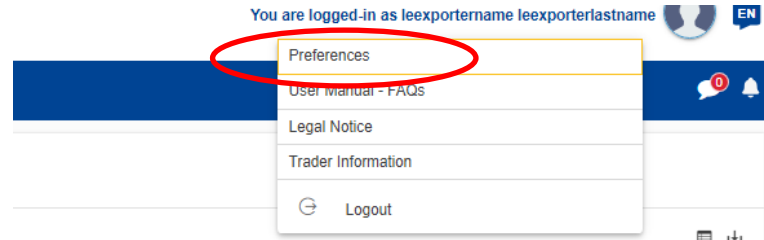

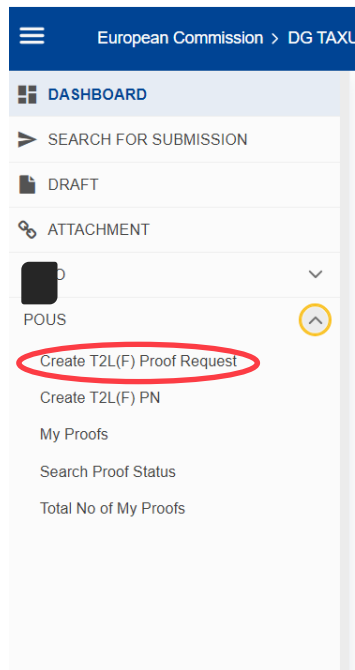

Requesting a T2L/T2LF where you are not an authorised issuer – Office of Departure

The person requiring a T2L/T2LF lodges an endorsement request to the Competent Customs Office in the PoUS system.

Note: on the STP it will be possible to view a submitted T2L/T2LF Request and create a new request by copying the existing one.

Copy T2L(F) Proof Request

What happens when you submit a T2L/T2LF in the PoUS Trader Portal? (non- authorised issuer)

- The PoUS request will have a status of **E- Under Evaluation**. The Customs officer in the Customs office you selected will review through the Back Office PoUS portal.
- Customs have the option to carry out a physical or documentary control. You will receive an update once logged into the trader portal which will indicate the type of control that Customs wish to carry out and any necessary action required by you. The status of the request will update to **E-Waiting for supplementary documents** where a documentary control is required.
(email prompt if registered for notifications per slide 11 & 12)
- If the control result is satisfactory or if no control is required then a Customs Officer endorses the request, the status updates to **E-Registered** and an **MRN** is allocated to the PoUS proof.
- The validity period is in general 90 days.
- Other possible statuses are **E-expired** and **E-rejected**.

(‘E’ indicates Endorsement stage)

- An authorised issuer does not have to submit an endorsement request. They submit a registration request and include their authorisation number.
- The authorised issuer is approved to issue the T2L or T2LF as proof.
- In this case, the authorised issuer will only need to request to register and submit the data. The initial status of the request will be **E under evaluation**.
- There is an associated time limit defined within the authorisation which provides Customs officers with an opportunity to control the request, the time limit is currently 15 minutes.
- When that time elapses, the proof will be automatically registered without any Customs officer intervention. The system will generate an MRN and the proof will then have a status of **E-Registered**.
- The validity period is in general 90 days.

Once Presentation Notification is submitted the status will update to **P-Under Evaluation**



Possible Responses from the Presentation Customs Office

- Customs officer at the Presentation customs office has the option to carry out a physical or documentary control before approving the Proof.
- You will receive an update once logged into the trader portal which will indicate the type of control (if any) to be carried out and any necessary action required by you.
- The status of the proof will update to **P-Waiting for supplementary documents** if supporting documents have been requested by customs.
(email prompt if registered for notifications per slide 11 & 12).
- If the control result is satisfactory or if no control is required then the customs officer will approve the usage and the status will update to **P-Used**.

(‘P’ indicates Presentation)

Amendments

- Once submitted amendments will not be accepted at endorsement request or presentation notification stage.
- The option to delete a submission is also not currently available on the system.
- The EU Commission are reviewing the possibility of enhancements to this system to allow both these options.
- If an error is noted in a submission, please contact the relevant Customs office to outline that the request or presentation notification should be rejected and a new entry will be submitted.
- On the STP it is possible to create a new request by copying an existing one and making the necessary amendments.

Key Points

- Electronic PoUS trader portal for T2L/T2LF goes live on **1st March 2024**.
- No change to the rules relating to PoUS – **Change to the processing for T2L/T2LF requests which will be only through the new PoUS Trader Portal.**
- To access the PoUS trader portal you will need:
 - An active in date [ROS certificate](#)
 - An [EORI](#) number and be registered for C&E on ROS
 - To be authenticated in the trader portal which is handled through [UUM&DS](#)
- You will not receive updates regarding your account on the STP via your ROS inbox, but you can sign up to receive email alerts any time there has been activity on your account, details on slides 11 &12.
