NOTICE TO EMPLOYERS & PENSION PROVIDERS

Department of Employment Affairs and Social Protection to cease issuing Illness Benefit and Occupational Injury Benefit Notifications to Employers

The Department of Employment Affairs and Social Protection (DEASP) has advised that, from 1 January 2018, it will cease issuing Illness and Occupational Injury Benefit notifications to employers. These notifications were issued to employers to assist them in calculating their employees' tax. As advised in the [October 2017 Employer Notice](#), Illness Benefit and Occupational Injury Benefit will be incorporated into employees' tax credit certificates from 1 January 2018 so employers will no longer require these notifications to calculate their employees' tax.
