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## 1. INTRODUCTION

Council Regulation (EC) 1005/2009 governs the importation and exportation of certain chemical substances known as ozone depleting substances (ODS). In general, the import and export of ODS is prohibited however some ODS may be imported or exported where the European Commission has granted a licence to the importer or exporter.

In Ireland, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is the competent authority with responsibility for the enforcement of this legislation. Revenue assists the EPA by the application of controls at importation and exportation.

## 3. ACTION TO BE TAKEN

The EPA has requested that imports or exports of certain ODS be flagged on the Customs AEP system. For this purpose profiles have been entered onto AEP. When a profile is activated the following steps should be taken:

- Consult the EU ODS database to confirm the existence of a licence for the consignment in question. See **Accessing ODS Database** Section below. If valid licence details are displayed in the ODS database, ensure that Box 44 of the SAD contains L100 followed by the Licence reference number. The consignment should then be allowed to proceed.

Where there are no corresponding licence details on the ODS database, detain the consignment and contact:

If staff have a suspicion that ODS are being imported or exported in contravention of Regulation 1005/2009, the consignment should be detained and Prohibitions & Restrictions Unit should be contacted.
