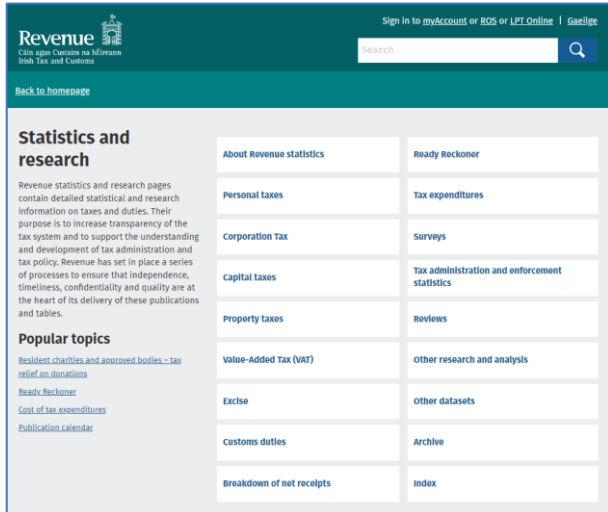


## New Statistics & Research Website Launched



At the beginning of October 2024, we launched our new [Statistics and Research section](#) on the Revenue website.

A key goal of the new website is improved usability and the new layout includes:

- A single landing page for Statistics and Research publications.
- Thematic groups – e.g. all publications associated with Personal Taxes appear under that tile.
- Cross linking – e.g. an Income Tax relief will appear under both the Personal Taxes and Tax Expenditures tile, this should make finding publications easier.
- Finally, there is an [Index page](#), that is populated with a complete listing of all Statistics & Research links on one page.

## Excise Registers

The Excise Acts, and their associated regulations, require that Revenue publish a series of registers for Excise customers. These registers are updated monthly:

- **Current Valid Licensed Auto Fuel Traders**
  - **Licensed Marked Fuel Traders**
  - **Register of Licensed Bookmakers**

- **Licensed Remote Bookmaking Operations**
  - **Register of Bookmaking Offices**
  - **Register of Renewed Liquor Licences**
