

Method Statement for Home Renovation Incentive (HRI) Statistics Monthly 2017 Dataset

1. Introduction

The purpose of this document is to provide information on the commitment to quality activities and procedures Revenue has put in place in respect of the production of Revenue Statistics to comply with the Irish Statistical System Code of Practice (ISSCOP).¹

This dataset provides monthly statistics relating to HRI scheme.

The HRI scheme, which was introduced in October 2013, allows homeowners who carry out qualifying renovation works to apply for and claim an income tax credit. In order to qualify for the tax credit, the following criteria must be met:

- The value of work carried out on a property must be at least €4,405 excluding VAT; and
- 2. Only works which are chargeable at the 13.5% VAT rate are counted towards the threshold.

If the total value of work carried out in a property does not exceed the minimum threshold, the home owner will not be eligible for any tax credit under the HRI scheme. However, there are no restrictions on the number of works a home owner may carry out in their property to reach this minimum threshold.
